Symbols



Warning of electrical voltage

Safety

General Power Tool Safety Warnings



Warning

Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury. Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term *power tool* in the warnings refers to your mainsoperated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Work area

- **Keep work area clean and well lit.** Clutter or dark areas invite accidents.
- Do not operate power tools in explosive atmosphere, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- Keep children and bystanders away while operating a **power tool.** Distractions can cause you to lose control.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Electrical safety

- Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.
- Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.
- When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use. Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.

If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Personal safety

Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.









Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection. Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.

- Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning **the power tool on.** A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.
- Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at **all times.** This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situation.
- Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair and clothing away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts.
- If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used. Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.
- Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool **safety principles.** A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.





General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Power tool use and care

- Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application. The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.
- Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off. Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.
- Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool. Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
- Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.
- Keep handles and grasping surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease. Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Battery tool use and care

- Recharge only with charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- Use power tools only with specifically designed battery packs. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.

- When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery; avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, additionally seek medical help. Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.

- Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the instructions. Charging improperly or at temperatures outsides the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.



General Power Tool Safety Warnings – Service

- Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.
- Never service damaged battery pack. Service of battery packs should only be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service providers.



Safety instructions for planers

- Wait for the cutter to stop before setting the tool down.
 An exposed rotating cutter may engage the surface leading to possible loss of control and serious injury.
- Use clamps or another practical way to secure and support the workpiece to a stable platform. Holding the workpiece by your hand or against the body leaves it unstable and may lead to loss of control.
- Only hold the power tool against the workpiece when the tool is switched on and running. Otherwise there is a risk of kickbacks.
- Do not use the power tool for processing metal.
 Otherwise, the blade or cutting head could be damaged.
- During operation hold onto the power tool with both hands and make sure you stand firmly on the ground.
 It is safer to handle the power tool with two hands.



- Do not under any circumstances use the power tool if you detect damages on the mains plug or power cable.
 If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, his service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.
 Defective power cables pose a serious health risk!
- Keep your hands away from the cutting head. Do not reach into the area between the power tool and the workpiece. Do not rest your hands near the power tool. Risk of injury upon contact with the blade.
- Do not treat the surface to be processed with liquids containing solvents. Toxic fumes may be produced during scraping owing to the heat-up of the materials.
- Use appropriate detection equipment to track down concealed supply lines or consult the local utility companies. Contact with electrical lines may result in fire and electric shock. Damaging a gas line may lead to an explosion. Penetrating a water line causes property damage and may cause an electric shock.
- Use sharp blades only.

Intended use

Only use the device PPLS 10-20V:

- for planing wood materials, e.g. beams and boards, while keeping base plate contact,
- for chamfering edges of wood materials while keeping base plate contact,
- for rebating wood materials while keeping base plate contact

whilst adhering to the technical data.

We recommend using the power tool with original Trotec accessories.

Foreseeable misuse

The device PPLS 10-20V is not suitable for planing metal.

The device is not intended for processing damp wood.

Any other use than the one described in the chapter "Intended use" is regarded as reasonably foreseeable misuse.

Personnel qualifications

People who use this device must:

 have read and understood the instructions, especially the Safety chapter.

Safety signs and labels on the battery

Note

Do not remove any safety signs, stickers or labels from the device. Keep all safety signs, stickers and labels in legible condition.

- 2. In the event of an emergency, remove the battery from the device: Hold the release button of the battery and pull the battery off the device as described in chapter "Removing the battery".
- 3. Do not insert the battery if the device is defective.



Information about the device

Device description

The device PPLS 10-20V is an electrical planer with an idle speed of 12,000 rpm for processing wooden surfaces.

The cutting depth can be set up to 1.5 millimetres at the rotary knob.

The lift-off device, which folds out automatically, prevents damage of the workpiece or blade when the device is put down.

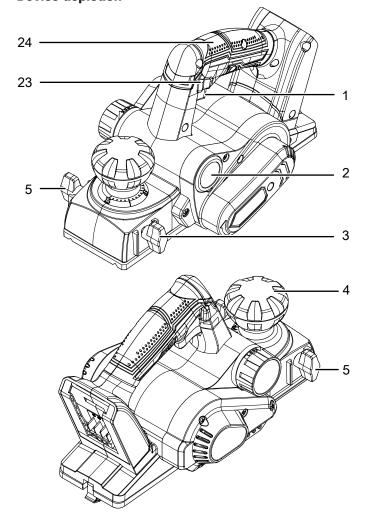
The 3 V grooves are suited for chamfering edges.

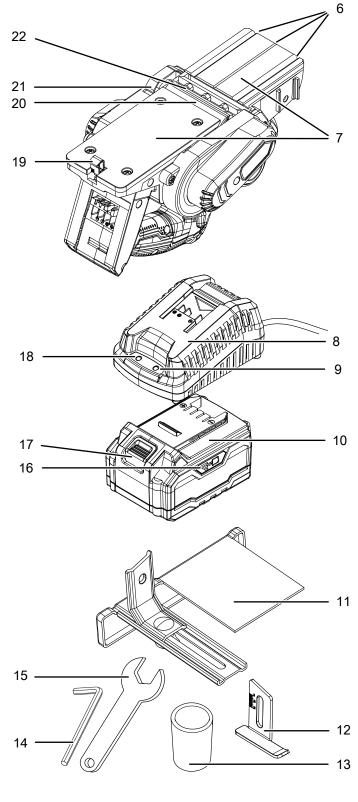
Chip ejection is possible on the left or right as desired.

The device is equipped with a start lock preventing unintentional switch-on of the device.

The battery comes with its own battery level indication. As a result you can check the current charging status without having to connect it to the device.

Information on noise and vibration:

- The specified total vibration and noise emission values were measured by means of a test procedure standardized in EN 62841 and can be consulted for the comparison of one power tool with another.
- The specified total vibration and noise emission values can also be used for preliminary load assessment.

• The actual vibration and noise emission may differ from the stated values during operation of the power tool. This depends on how the power tool is used and especially on the type of workpiece being processed. Try to keep the vibration load to a minimum. Exemplary measures for reducing the vibration load include wearing gloves during operation of the tool and the limitation of working hours. All parts of an operating cycle must be considered for this (e.g. times at which the power tool is switched off and times when it is switched on but runs without load).

Transport and storage

Transport

Before transporting the device, observe the following:

- Switch off the device.
- Hold onto the mains plug while pulling the power cable of the charger out of the mains socket.
- Allow the device to cool down.
- Remove the battery from the device.
- If attached, disconnect the dust extraction system from the device.

The supplied Li-ion batteries are subjects to the requirements of dangerous goods legislation.

Observe the following when transporting or shipping Li-ion batteries:

• The user may transport the batteries by road without any additional requirements.

- If transport is carried out by third parties (e.g. air transport or forwarding company), special requirements as to packaging and labelling must be observed. This includes consulting a dangerous goods specialist when preparing the package.
 - Only ship batteries if their housing is undamaged.
 - Mask open terminals with tape and pack the battery in a way that it cannot move inside the packaging.
 - Please also observe any other national regulations.

Storage

Before storing the device, proceed as follows:

- Switch off the device.
- Hold onto the mains plug while pulling the power cable of the charger out of the mains socket.
- Allow the device to cool down.
- Remove the battery from the device.
- If attached, disconnect the dust extraction system from the device.
- Clean the device as described in the Maintenance chapter.
- Do not store Li-ion batteries which are completely discharged. Storing discharged batteries can lead to a deep discharge and thus damage the battery.

When the device is not being used, observe the following storage conditions:

- dry and protected from frost and heat
- Ambient temperature below 45 °C
- protected from dust and direct sunlight

Charging the battery

Note

The battery can be damaged in case of improper charging.

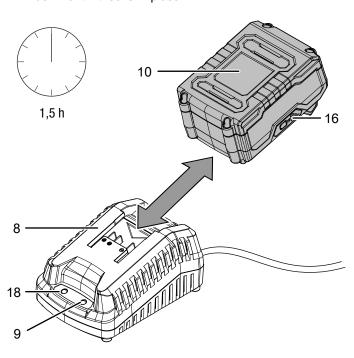
Remove the charger's mains plug before inserting or removing the battery.

Never charge the battery at ambient temperatures below 10 °C or above 40 °C.

The battery is partially charged upon delivery to avoid damage to the battery caused by a deep discharge.

Prior to initial start-up and when the battery is low (only the red LED in the battery level indication (16) is illuminated), the battery should be charged. To do so, please proceed as follows:

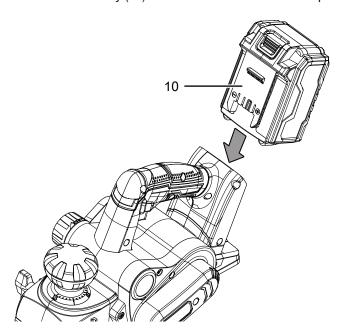
1. Slide the battery (10) onto the quick charger (8) upside down until it locks in place.



- 2. Insert the mains plug of the quick charger (8) into a properly fused mains socket.
 - ⇒ The red battery LED (9) lights up.
 - ⇒ Charging requires approx. one and a half hours.
- 3. Wait until the red battery LED (9) goes off and the green battery LED (18) lights up.
 - ⇒ The battery (10) is fully charged.
- 4. Hold onto the mains plug while pulling the power cable of the quick charger (8) out of the mains socket.
 - The battery (10) and the quick charger (8) may have become warm during charging.
 Allow the battery (10) to cool down to room temperature.
- 5. Take the battery (10) out of the quick charger (8) by pressing and holding the release button (17) and pulling the battery (10) off the quick charger (8).

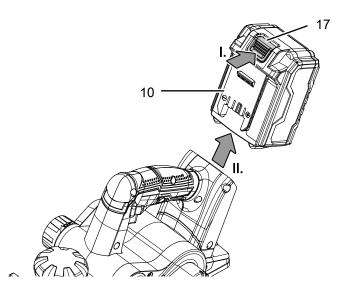
Inserting the battery

1. Slide the battery (10) onto the device until it locks in place.



Removing the battery

1. Detach the battery (10) from the device by pressing and holding the unlocking button (17, I.) and pulling the battery off the device (II.).



2. If required, charge the battery (10) as described in the section *Charging the battery*.



Checking the battery charging status

The battery comes with an integrated battery level indication. The battery status is displayed as follows by the three LEDs of the battery level indication (16):

LED colour	Meaning
Green – Orange – Red	maximum charge / power
Orange – Red	medium charge / power
	weak charge – Recharge the battery.

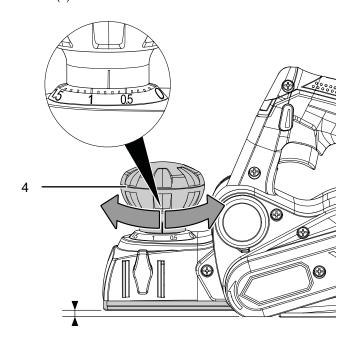
- 1. Press on the battery icon (25) on the battery (10).
 - ⇒ You can read the battery status from the battery level indication (16).



Setting the cutting depth

The cutting depth can be set in steps of 0.1 mm in the range between 0 mm and 1.5 mm.

1. You can set the desired cutting depth at the rotary knob (4).

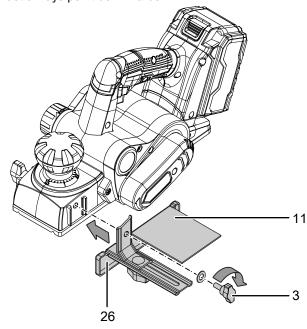


Mounting the rip fence

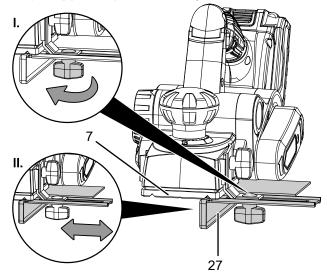
The rip fence serves as a guide for precise working at the edge of a workpiece. Furthermore, you can use the rip fence to reduce the width of the planing track or of the base plate resting on the workpiece.

Proceed as follows to mount the rip fence:

1. Use the fastening screw (3) to fasten the rip fence (11) to the left side of the device. Note that the guide rail (26) must always point downwards.



2. Loosen the set screw (27) to adjust the width of the base plate (7) or the position of the guide.



3. Tighten the set screw (27) after the desired position has been set.



Info

If you are using the rip fence, apply slight lateral pressure on the device while guiding it over the workpiece.

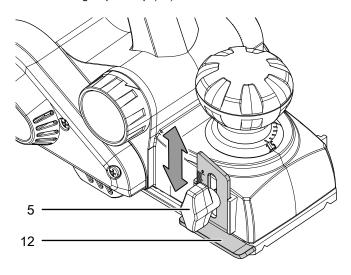


Adjusting the rebating depth stop

The rebating depth stop serves to adjust the depth of the planing track on your workpiece.

Please proceed as follows to adjust the rebating depth stop:

1. Set the desired depth using the fastening screw (5) at the rebating depth stop (12).





Info

If you are using the rebating depth stop and the rip fence simultaneously, you can create steps with the desired depth (rebating depth stop) and width (rip fence).

Adjusting the chip ejector

You can mount the chip ejector on the left or right-hand side of the device as needed.

The chip ejector is already preassembled.



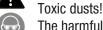

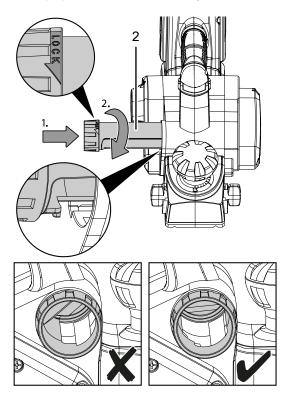
Please proceed as follows to attach the chip ejector to the other side of the device:

1. Detach the chip ejector (2) by turning it in the opposite direction of the arrow (LOCK).

2. Pull the chip ejector out of the device (2).



- 3. Clean the chip ejector if necessary.
- 4. Slide the chip ejector into the device on the other side. Pay attention to the position of the opening at the device and of the notch at the chip ejector while doing so.
- Lock the chip ejector (2) by turning it fully in the direction of the arrow (LOCK). The opening of the device and of the chip ejector must fit each other precisely so that all dust and chips produced will be discharged.





Operation

Tips and notes on handling the planer

General information:

- At the beginning, only position the front part of the device on the workpiece.
- Only guide the part of the device where the cutting head is located against the workpiece after the device has been switched on.
- Guide the device over the workpiece in an even forward motion. Hold onto the device with both hands; one hand at the rotary knob (4) and the other one at the device handle (24). The front and rear base plate should fully rest on the workpiece.

Planing:

- Use sharp blades only. Worn blades can yield an uneven result.
- If you want to use the full planing width or process hard wood, we recommend choosing a small cutting depth and working with a slow forward motion.
- For a higher surface quality, we recommend applying the pressure on the centre of the device and working with a slow and even forward motion.

Using the lift-off device

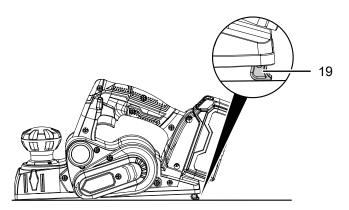
The lift-off device serves as an aid when putting the device down and for protecting the workpiece.

Note

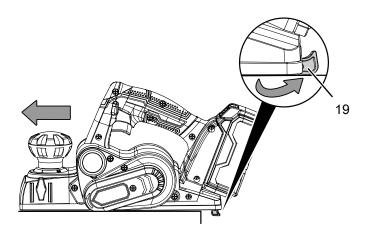
Never remove the lift-off device from the device. A missing lift-off device causes instability of the device and can damage the workpiece or device.

Please proceed as follows to use the lift-off device:

1. Make sure that the lift-off device (19) folds down when the device is lifted, and put the device down safely.



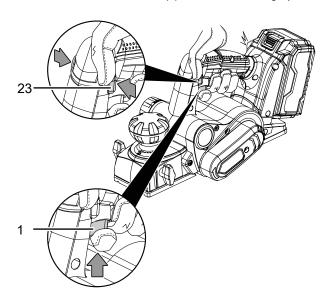
If you want to continue working, first position the front base plate and, while advancing, bring the rear base plate into contact with the workpiece. The lift-off device (19) will automatically fold up.



Switching the device on and off

Wear your personal protective equipment when working with the device.

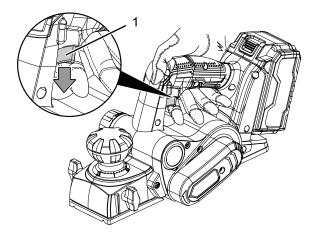
- 1. Check whether the set cutting depth is suitable for the intended application.
- 2. Check whether the workpiece is secured and the worktop prepared correspondingly.
- 3. Position the front base plate on the workpiece.
- 4. Press the start lock (23) to be able to actuate the on/off switch.
- 5. Press the on/off switch (1) and hold it during operation.



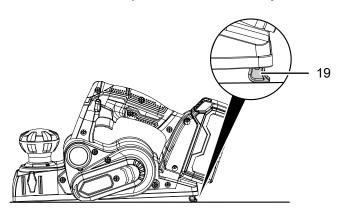
6. Slowly guide the device along the workpiece while applying slight, even pressure.



7. Let go of the on/off switch (1) to switch the device off. Please note that the cutting head continues running for a while.

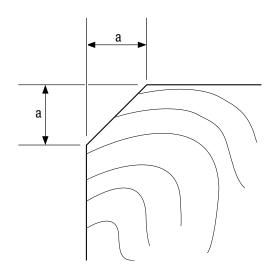


8. Make sure that the lift-off device (19) folds down when the device is lifted, and put the device down safely.



Chamfering edges

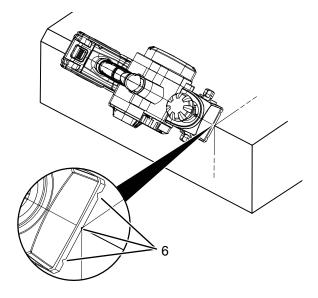
You can use the V grooves at the front base plate to chamfer edges. These grooves determine the width of the chamfer and additionally serve as a guide.

medium	approx. 4 to 9
large	approx. 6 to 10

Please proceed as follows to chamfer edges:

1. Position the front base plate on the edge of the workpiece with the desired V groove (6). Make sure that the device is positioned at an angle of 45° to the workpiece.



2. Guide the device along the edge while applying even pressure.



Connecting the dust extraction system

You can connect a vacuum cleaner to the device. The adapter included in the scope of delivery allows to connect smaller pipe diameters.

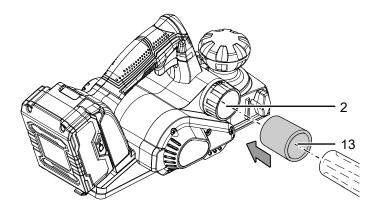


Caution

Use a special vacuum cleaner to suck off harmful or toxic materials.

Please proceed as follows to connect the dust extraction system:

- 1. If necessary, change the side of the chip ejection as described in chapter "Adjusting the chip ejection".
- 2. Connect a suitable vacuum cleaner (e.g. industrial vacuum cleaner) directly to the chip ejector (2).
- 3. If required, you can connect the adapter (13) for the dust extraction system to the chip ejector (2) first.



Connecting a dust bag (optional)

For small-scale work, you can optionally connect a dust bag.

- 1. Insert a suitable dust or chip bag firmly into the chip ejector (2).
- 2. Empty the dust bag in due time to guarantee proper absorption of a sufficient amount of dust and chips.

Errors and faults

The device has been checked for proper functioning several times during production. If malfunctions occur nonetheless, check the device according to the following list.

Troubleshooting tasks which require the housing to be opened must only be carried out by an authorized specialist electrical company or by Trotec.

Light smoke or odour is emitted during the first use:

 This is not a fault. These phenomena disappear after a brief runtime.

The battery does not charge:

 Check whether the battery is inserted correctly in the quick charger.

Slide the battery into the quick charger in a way that the battery terminals engage in the quick charger. The battery must lock in place in the quick charger.

- Check the power connection.
- Check the power cable and mains plug for damage.
- Check the on-site fusing.
- Check the quick charger for damage. If the quick charger is damaged, stop using it. Contact the Trotec customer service.
- Check the battery terminals for dirt. Remove any dirt.
- The battery might be defective and have to be replaced.
 Only use batteries of the same type.



The device does not start:

- The battery power might be too low. Recharge the battery.
- Check whether the battery is correctly connected to the device.

Slide the battery onto the device in a way that the battery terminals engage. The battery must lock in place in the device.

Check the battery terminals for dirt. Remove any dirt.



Info

Wait for at least 10 minutes before switching the device back on.

The device's performance decreases:

- Check for slippage between the cutting head and the motor. This indicates ageing of the drive belt. It must be exchanged. Contact the Trotec customer service.
- Check whether the blades are correctly inserted. If necessary, insert them correctly, see Tool change chapter.
- Check whether the blades are blunt and may have to be replaced, see Tool change chapter.
- Check whether the chip ejector is clogged. Clean it if necessary, see Cleaning chapter.

The planing result is not as desired:

- Check the cutting depth and adjust it if necessary.
- Check whether the chip ejector is clogged. Clean it if required.

The device becomes hot:

- Make sure not to exert too much pressure on the device during operation.
- Keep the venting slots clear to prevent the motor from overheating.
- Wait for at least 10 minutes before switching the device back on.

Note

Wait for at least 3 minutes after maintenance and repair work. Only then switch the device back on.

Your device still does not operate correctly after these checks?

Please contact the customer service. If necessary, bring the device to an authorised specialist electrical company or to Trotec for repair.

Notes on maintenance

Inside the device, there are no parts that need to be maintained or lubricated by the user.

Safety signs on the battery

Check the safety signs attached to the battery at regular intervals. Replace illegible safety signs!

Cleaning

The device should be cleaned before and after each use.

Note

The device does not have to be lubricated after cleaning.



Warning of electrical voltage

There is a risk of a short-circuit due to liquids penetrating the housing!

Do not immerse the device and the accessories in water. Make sure that no water or other liquids can enter the housing.

- Clean the device with a soft, damp and lint-free cloth.
 Make sure that no moisture enters the housing. Protect electrical components from moisture. Do not use any aggressive cleaning agents such as cleaning sprays, solvents, alcohol-based or abrasive cleaners to dampen the cloth.
- Dry the device with a soft, lint-free cloth.
- Keep the connecting terminals on the device and charger clean.
- Keep the ventilation openings free from dust deposits to prevent overheating of the motor.
- Remove dust and chips from the chip ejector. If the chip ejector is blocked, clean it with suitable means (e.g. compressed air).
- Clean the lift-off device regularly to make sure that it moves freely.

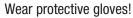

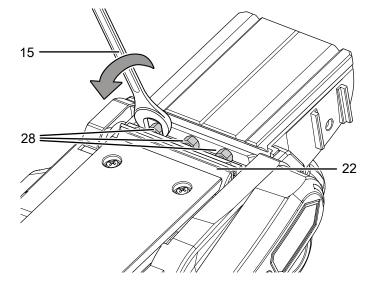

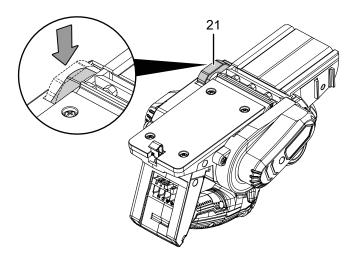
The hexagonal bolts must not be loosened! The Allen wrench only serves to adjust the height of the tension element if you want to insert another type of blades.

Please proceed as follows to turn over or change the blades:

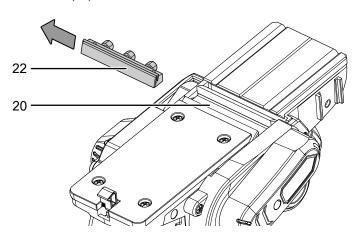
- 1. Remove the battery from the device.
- 2. Use the open-end wrench (15) to loosen the 3 nuts (28) at the tension element (22).



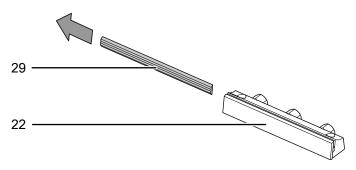
3. Slide the protective cover (21) of the cutting head back and hold it in place.



4. Slide the tension element (22) sideways out of the cutting head (20).



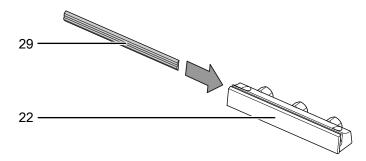
5. Use a suitable tool to carefully slide the blade (29) out of the tension element (22).



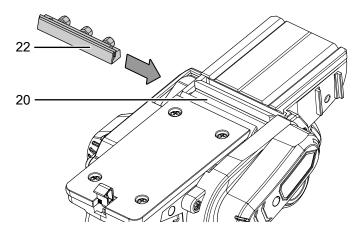
- 6. If required, clean the tension element and the blade with a dry, lint-free cloth or a brush.
- 7. Turn the blade over or replace it.



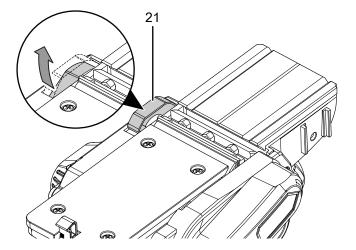
8. Carefully slide the blade (29) into the tension element (22).



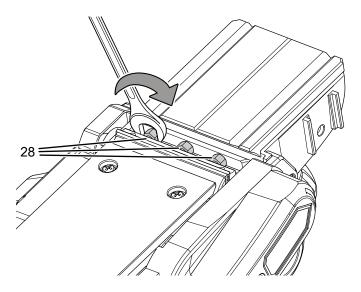
- 9. Slide the protective cover (21) of the cutting head back and hold it in place.
- 10. Slide the tension element (22) into the cutting head (20). Make sure that the cutting edge is correctly aligned.



11. Bring the protective cover (21) of the cutting head into the correct position by letting go of it.



12. Retighten the 3 nuts (28) at the tension element.



13. Turn the cutting head (20) by 180° and repeat the procedure with the other tension element.
